

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS

Standard pots must be used. The inside diameter of the pot should be approximate to the perpendicular height and the diameter at the top should be appreciably greater than the diameter at the bottom (i.e. the pot should have a distinct taper). Half pots or shrub pots are not allowed.

The colour of the pots must be terracotta - except for hanging pots.

The class for hanging pots will be judged as for baskets. Only commercial hanging pots will be permitted.

SHOW DEFINITIONS

Standard - A standard must have no more than one support. All standards must be a single stem. The dimensions refer to the length of the clear stem between the surface of the compost and the lowest branch.

Bush - A bush is an exhibit which must be developed on a single stem not exceeding 1½". The entire exhibit should be covered with a healthy abundance of foliage and flower which should be of the size expected of the cultivar being shown. The exhibit should present a balanced shape when viewed from all angles.

Shrub - A shrub is an exhibit with more than one shoot emerging from below compost level. It can be developed from more than one plant. The entire exhibit should be covered with a healthy abundance of foliage and flower which should be as expected of the cultivar being shown. The exhibit should present a balanced shape when viewed from all angles.

SHOW RULES

1. The OPEN Section of the competition (apart from class 17) is open to all. The NOVICE section is only open to people who have **not** won a First prize at any fuchsia show.
2. Exhibitors may only have one entry in any class.
3. Exhibitors should lodge an entry form with the Show Secretary on Sunday morning and obtain their class cards immediately on arrival at the hall. Class cards must be placed face downwards with the appropriate entry in each class. Each plant should have a variety card.
4. All plants must have been the property of the exhibitor for at least three months prior to the show. This also applies to plants from which flowers are taken. All plants must be shown in the pots in which they are grown.
5. The Judges will be at liberty to withhold any prize if the exhibit is not considered worthy.
6. While judging is in progress, all persons except the Judges, Stewards and Officers of the Society officially retained, must retire from the hall.
7. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st = 3 points; 2nd = 2 points; 3rd = 1 point. In the event of a tie for the most points in the show, the award will be given to the competitor gaining the most firsts.
8. Any protest must be made in writing to the Secretary before 3.00pm on the day of judging.
9. The Committee shall have the power to declare any exhibits disqualified if a protest is upheld, their decision is final.
10. No exhibits or class cards may be removed before the close of the Show.
11. All perpetual cups and trophies presented by the Society are held by the winners for one year and must be returned to the Secretary.
12. All plants entered should be free from pests and diseases. Any plant considered to be carrying pests or diseases will be removed from the Hall. In this matter the Judges' decision is final.
13. Any matter not provided for in these rules will be dealt with by the Committee, whose decision will be accepted as final.
14. In the craft class the item must be the exhibitor's own work.

NOVICE SECTION

Open to members and non members who have not won a first prize at any Society show.

1. ONE POT, single or double flowered, pot not exceeding 3½" (90mm).
2. ONE POT, single or double flowered, pot not exceeding 5¼" (134mm).
3. ONE POT, any variety any size of pot.
4. ONE POT, any variety any size of pot. CHILDREN'S entry only.

OPEN SECTION

Open to all members and non members, excluding classes 17.

5. ONE POT, any variety, in 3½" (90mm) pot.
6. THREE POTS, any variety / varieties, in 3½" (90mm) pots.
7. ONE POT, any variety, to be grown in 4" (102mm) pot.
8. TWO POTS, one variety, in 4" (102mm) pots, to be judged as matching pair.
9. ONE POT, single flowered, pot not exceeding 5¼" (134mm)
10. ONE POT, double flowered, pot not exceeding 5¼" (134mm).
11. TWO POTS, pots not exceeding 5¼" (134mm).
12. ONE POT, single flowered, pot not exceeding 6½" (165mm).
13. ONE POT, double flowered, pot not exceeding 6½" (165mm).
14. TWO POTS, any variety / varieties, pots not exceeding 6½" (165mm).
15. ONE POT, any variety, any size of pot.
16. ONE POT of an ornamental foliage type, any size of pot.
Classes 1 – 16 may be grown as bush or shrub.
17. (See MEMBER'S SECTION)
18. ONE POT Encliandra. Any size pot up to 6" (154mm).
19. ONE POT species, including sub-species and variants. Any sized pot.
20. ONE POT, Triphylla in 6½" (165mm) maximum pot.
21. ONE POT, Triphylla in any size pot.
22. ONE POT, Unusual cultivar or unusual shape, pot not exceeding 10" (254 mm).
23. ONE MINI STANDARD, 6 to 10" (154 to 254mm), pot not to exceed 5¼" (134mm).
24. ONE QUARTER STANDARD, 10" to 18" (254mm to 457mm).
25. ONE HALF STANDARD, 18" to 30" (457mm to 762mm) **or**
 ONE FULL STANDARD, 30" to 42" (762mm to 1067mm).
26. ONE FUCHSIA, any cultivar, trained as a bonsai in a bonsai dish.
27. ONE BOWL of floating flower heads.
28. "TWELVE BLOOMS" shown on board.
29. "SIX BLOOMS", one variety, shown on board.
Classes 28 & 29 should be staged on boards provided by the Society. The judges look for a display of unblemished even sized blooms at an identical stage of development.
30. ONE personally taken photograph of a fuchsia or fuchsias, conventional or digital.
31. ONE ITEM in any craft depicting a fuchsia(s). Must be exhibitor's own work.

32. ONE OR MORE PLANTS grown in hanging pot not exceeding 12" (305mm).
33. ONE HANGING BASKET not exceeding 16" (406mm).
